Have you thought about praying for your neighbours?

This could be an outside prayer walk or praying from the comfort of your own home. Here are some ideas to help you

PRAYER WALKING

- **Whilst walking to the shop or post box**
- **Walking the Dog**
- **A daily 5 minutes in the fresh air**

Whilst walking look at the houses around you (without looking into people's windows). Imagine the people behind the closed doors and the half closed blinds. Even though you may not know your neighbours pray for peace and safety in their homes, pray for comfort and joy whether they are experiencing good or difficult times.

Pray that God's Holy Spirit will cause them to look to Jesus.

INDOOR NEIGHBOURHOOD PRAYING

Take yourself to a quiet place in your house and look out of the window. Intentionally look at the homes around you and pray for the people behind those doors, people you know and people you don't.

Pray for the street, name the street out loud and pray for protection and peace to be upon the street where you live. Pray for the children and young people in school, colleges and universities. Pray for those who work and those who are unemployed. Pray especially for the older adults on your street that they will know they are not alone. and pray for others to see them and encourage them.
