

How the research was conducted:


- ComRes Savanta 10 minute on-line survey of 4,000 UK adults
- Field work was from 28th Jan 13th Feb 2022
- Nat representative sample of 3115 UK adults
- Boost sample of 917 Practising Christians
- Combined dataset weighted by gender, age and region
- 1.54% margin of error








Where would people go to find out about the Christian faith




Non-Christians who know a practising Christian

How non-Christians describe the Christian that they know





















How are the conversations going?








Conclusion and next steps
